Frequently Asked Questions about Summer Camp

1. What is the total cost per person and what does it include?

Total cost is **\$270/ person** and it includes activities, room and board (4 nights lodging and 11 meals), camp materials, and camp t-Shirt.

2. When is total cost due?

The final balance is not due until **June 1, 2012** but you will need a \$50/person deposit in order to register.

3. Can I register without a deposit? And do I need names to register?

You cannot register without a deposit. You will need a **\$50/person** to reserve those spaces and the total number of participants (chaperones and campers). **Spaces are limited** and most weeks will fill up, so reserve as soon as possible to get your desired week.

4. When do I receive camp paperwork?

The entire registration process will be done online this year. To start this process, click the register tab found at the top of our website and follow the instructions. All paperwork, such as medical forms, will be handled through this account. If you have any questions about this process, please call our office at 704-434-2920.



5. What if someone backs out. Do I get their deposit back or can I transfer it to the remaining balance?

Unfortunately, no. However, you can replace that person with someone else and transfer their deposit to the other person. And if you let us know before the **June 1, 2012 deadline**, you will not be charged the remaining balance for that person.

6. Will I be able to add to my group total?

As long as there is space available. If there isn't space left, we can always put them down on a waiting list.

7. What is the age limit for camp?

Each camper should have completed sixth grade and be no older than a graduating senior. College students are welcome to attend as chaperones.

8. Can I come to camp as an individual or with a small group that is not a church?

Yes and No. As long as you have a chaperone, we will welcome any group regardless of size. Unfortunately, we cannot have any teenagers un-chaperoned.

9. What about Day Campers?

Unfortunately, we cannot take day campers. Any person desiring to come to camp must have a chaperone and has to participate in the entire week.

10. What are the accommodations like?

You will be staying in college dormitories based on your gender. Each room is double occupancy and has two twin beds, two desks, two chairs, and two dressers. *(There are a few one and three person rooms on campus that we use.)* Bathrooms vary based on each dorm. *(Some rooms have private baths, some share with the room next to it, and some have hallway baths shared by all.)* You will need to bring your own linens.

11. What if someone in my group has special needs?

If you will let us know in advance, we will try to meet those needs. Gardner-Webb is a Handicap Accessible University, including dorm rooms.

12. How many chaperones do I need to bring and what are their responsibilities?

You will need to bring 1 chaperone for every **8-10** teenagers. This needs to be separate for both males and females. Their responsibilities are to make sure that all of your teenagers are getting to where they need to be throughout the day. They are also there to help advise and counsel your teenagers with their daily walks with Christ. Throughout the day, chaperones will participate in all activities as if they were a camper themselves except tournaments, they are just for campers. ***You must have at least one male and one female chaperone if your group contains both genders.***

13. What if one of my chaperones has children they need to bring with them?

Camp life, especially dorm life, is not conducive for children. We want chaperones to be focused on the campers as much as possible. We ask that no children are brought to camp for those two very important reasons.

14. What do the morning and evening worship services look like?

The morning celebration time is more casual and contains the Crossroads Morning Show. It is a fun and casual way to begin the day.

The evening service is much more structured and involves Praise/Worship Music as well as sermons from Clayton King and Matt Orth.

15. What are the afternoon activities?

During the afternoon, you and your group will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities, which includes, but is not limited to:

Soccer, Basketball, Ultimate Frisbee, Frisbee Golf, Volleyball, Arts/Crafts, Music Studio, Board Games, Musical Lounge/Jam Sessions, Team Challenge Course, Dodge Ball, Sports Tournaments, Obstacle Course, Epic Group Game, Climbing Tower, Day at the River, Prayer Experience, Dance Lessons, Photography, Improv, and more...

They can choose whichever activity/(ies) they wish from 1-5pm. Some of these activities are open to anyone anytime. Other activities require sign-up and they will have the opportunity to do so when you arrive and throughout camp. They do not need to sign up for activities before camp.

None of these activities are mandatory, but we strongly encourage you and your chaperones to make them mandatory among your group. In other words, you have the option of requiring your students to participate in some type of activity for the duration of these 4 hours. Your students will only have free time if you allow them to.

16. What are the morning workshops?

Morning workshops are a time where we teach the scriptures in a way your students can understand more fully what it means to be a disciple of Jesus in today's culture. Each student will attend three workshops.

17. What does the basic schedule look like?

18. What is church group time? When is church group time?

Church group time is a time in which your particular group will be able to get together and recap the day. We provide no structure for this time in an effort to allow you to do as you see fit. Some groups talk about the day and what they have learned and are learning, some groups also come prepared with four devotions for the week, etc. This is your time with your group at the end of each day.

*** IMPORTANT FINANCIAL INFORMATION ***

- A registration deposit of \$50 per person is required for all CRWW camps. Paying this deposit completes the registration process and reserves the group's spots. The deposit is non-refundable. If a camper cancels, their deposit cannot be applied to a group balance, but can be transferred to another person as their deposit.
- Once registered, you can add campers to your total as long as space permits. Please call our office to verify space availability when adding campers.
- Final balances must be sent in by June 1, 2012. **There will be a \$5 per person per day late fee added to any balances not paid by June 1, 2012.** Please call our office if you will not be able to meet the deadline.
- Note: Balance payments are refundable if cancelled **in writing before the balance due date.** After the due date ***no refunds*** will be issued.
- ***** After the balance due date – you are responsible for payment of the number registered at that date, even if your group does not come to camp.**
- If you have cancellations, please call **before** the due date to avoid paying the balance for spaces you will not be using. You will still be financially responsible for any cancellations after the balance due date.
- Fees must be paid with a church check, personal check, money order or credit card. \$25 will be charged for a returned check. There will be a 2% surcharge on any payments made with a credit or debit card. If you have any questions, please contact us by phone at (704) 434-2920.
